SUMMER RECREATION_____

4th of July – Trustee Smith gave a report on behalf of Summer Recreation Director Chad Glosson. The Volleyball and Tug-of-War Tournaments held during the 4th of July celebration were very successful. The Baseball program had approximately 75 kids participating this year. As for the 4th of July, it was suggested to run the kid's games consecutively next year rather than at different times. The music provided during the OVFD's RMO dinner was well received. The WCSO, the Explorers and the Colorado State Patrol made a good impression with their attendance at the event.

<u>Swim Bus</u> – Swim bus driver S Stackhouse reported having 8 kids for fun swim riding the bus. She asked the Board if it was alright to still drive the bus to swim lessons for the 8 kids that were registered in which they were all in agreement.

<u>Part Time Summer Help</u> – Six applications have been received to date. Parks & Recreation Committee will meet Friday, July 15th, at Town Hall at 8:00 am to look over the applications and conduct interviews.

<u>Town Attorney Memo</u> – Town Attorney Matthew Richardson introduced himself to the Board. He explained the handout "Powers and Duties of Statutory Town Officers" giving the Board a clear picture of their powers and duties as elected officials of a Colorado statutory town. Town Attorney Richardson also suggested to the Board they might want to consider rewriting Ordinance #2 – "An Ordinance to Create the Offices of Town Clerk and Town Treasurer to Provide for their Election at and after the Annual Town Election in 1918" and Ordinance #3 – "An Ordinance to Define the Duties of Town Clerk". He also suggested a written Resolution clearly defining job descriptions and the hierarchy of power. Overall, by following State Statutes and the Town Ordinances the Board, as a whole, should be on the same page.

MAYOR REPORT_____

Mayor Gale reported approximately 58 people attended the June 9th showing of Jurassic World. He also said donations have been running on the short side.

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Town Clerk Jamison informed the Board her part time help is scheduled to have surgery and would be unavailable for a while. Therefore, when needing to close Town Hall early Jamison will put notice on the door listing the dates and times of closures. Burn Permits were discussed and future permits will not be written out per phone calls. In order to keep a better record of the burn permits citizens must come to Town Hall to register for one in person. Town Clerk Jamison then informed the Board that Trustee Bethel asked to be removed from the Parks & Recreation Committee and added to the Finance Committee. In regards to a Town dumpster taken to a private residence, the wrong resident was billed in error and could we certify the dumpster charge against the rightful owner of the property with the Washington County Treasurer. Trustee Rogers made a motion to certify the delinquent bill for nonpayment of charges to the Washington County Treasurer. Trustee Smith seconded. Voting resulted:
